Her T.V. work includes ANNA KARENINA: ENEMY AT THE DOOR: POLDARK, and most recently LEAVING - all for B.B.C.

CHRIS RYAN was trained at E.15. Drama School and began his acting career at The Citizen's Theatre, Glasgow. Among his recent London appearances, he has just completed 9 months at The Mermaid Theatre in Steinbeck's OF MICE AND MEN, and the lead role in Dario Fo's, CAN'T PAY WON'T PAY at The Criterion Theatre. People will be familiar with his appearances as one of the foursome in the T.V. series THE YOUNG ONES.

AMANDA RANDALL was trained at the Hampstead Studios. Her first acting job was at Harrogate Rep. Theatre where she stayed for two seasons. She has appeared at The Gardner Arts Centre, Brighton, and has completed seasons at The Belgrade Theatre, Coventry, and The Connaught, Worthing. She appeared in SWAN ESTHER at The Young Vic & was recently seen in the T.V. Arena production of IT'S ALL TRUE.

HARRY LANDIS started as an actor in plays such as THE KITCHEN by A Wesker at The Royal Court, & R.C. Sherrif's JOURNEYS END at the Cambridge Theatre. He turned to directing in the early 70's, and after directing national tours became Artistic Director of The Marlowe Theatre, Canterbury for two years. Since then he has returned to acting and free-lance directing. His films include, THE LONGEST DAY; BILLY LIAR; BITTER VICTORY and RANSOM. He has made over 500 T.V. appearances, the latest of which are HOWARDS WAY and THE CAUCASIAN CHALK CIRCLE.
